William Little

- **1802** Nathaniel Little was operating a store in Blandford, Massachusetts. He also joined the Scioto Company, which is the organization which founded Worthington, Ohio.
- **1802, July** Nathaniel Little sells his business in Blandford, Massachusetts
- **1802** July October Nathaniel accompanies James Kilbourne on a 2000 mile trip into the Northwest Territory.
- **1804** Nathaniel Little is in Worthington
- **1808** Nathaniel Little and Ruben Lamb were partners in a general Store in Delaware. William Little worked in the store as there was already a saddle maker living in Delaware.
- **1808 October** Nathaniel Little, Ruben Lamb, and William Little appear on the first list of Delaware County electors.
- **1813 January 10** Nathaniel Little died, William Little served as co-Executor with Nathaniel Little's wife, thus Nathaniel and William are presumed to be brothers.
- **1813** William Little became Ruben Lamb's partner.
- **1820** May 1 the partnership with Lamb was dissolved, and William Little became sole owner.
- **1828 March 30** Benjamin Powers and William Little signed an agreement for a partnership for 3 years operating the mercantile business under the name of William Little & Company.
- **1835, June 18** B. Powers in merchandise business for himself. It is not clear when the partner-ship dissolved.

Nathaniel Little and Dr. Ruben Lamb opened a general store in Delaware about 1808. William had been a merchant in Massachusetts. William Little worked in Little and Lamb's store. Nathaniel Little died in 1813, when William Little became Dr. Lamb's partner.

"May 1, 1820 the Lamb and Little firm dissolved as a partnership and continued under the ownership of William Little."
